AREA HISTORY

Developed in the 1950s and 1960s by independent builders and once considered a suburb of Houston, the Timbergrove/Lazybrook area provides a wooded and well-maintained environment for its residents. The tree-lined streets are filled with homes on large lots, many of which feature oak hardwood floors and vintage 1950s touches like colored bathroom tiles. White Oak Bayou meanders through the area, cutting it in half — with the east side offering smaller traditional frame houses, and the west side larger, brick ranch homes. The neighborhood is home to the Timbergrove Nature Preserve and acres of parks, and stringent deed restrictions ensure that the area's charm is kept intact. Amenities such as an active civic association and a small town atmosphere make Timbergrove/Lazybrook an ideal place for anyone to call home.
